Data Processing Policy

Use of membership data MMS membership database is administered in the Society's office in Manchester. The data controller is the MMS. We use the data recorded by members on the membership application for operational purposes. For example, subscription administration, compilation of mailing lists, including electronic lists, to communicate information about MMS meetings. We do not pass personal data to third parties unless they are acting on our behalf eg the John Rylands University Library who issue library cards and keep the Manchester Collection.

INFORMATION FOR FELLOWS AND APPLICANTS FOR FELLOWSHIP

1. PERSONS ELIGIBLE

Holders of medical or dental qualifications which are provisionally, temporarily or permanently registerable in the United Kingdom are eligible as candidates for Fellowship.

2. SECTIONAL MEMBERSHIP

The Society contains ten Sections: Medicine, Surgery, Pathology, Anaesthesia, Odontology, Primary Care, Paediatrics (known as the Manchester Paediatric Club), Psychiatry, Public Health Forum and Imaging. Fellows may apply for membership of one or more individual Sections. Such Sectional membership confers the additional right of holding office and participating in the management of the particular Section without the payment of extra subscription.

3. MEETINGS

Meetings are held under the aegis of the Society itself and by each of the Sections. All the meetings, irrespective of origin, are open to all members of the Society. A provisional list of meetings to be held during the year is published in the Annual Report and in addition a monthly programme is sent to each member. The period covered by the programme is normally from late September to early May. The Society endeavours to obtain the appropriate accreditation for its meeting under the CME and PGEA regulations.

4. LIBRARY SERVICES

Fellows of the Society are entitled to use the University Library which includes the long-established Medical Library. The modern library of monographs is richly supplemented by a substantial selection of pre – 1800 material and many early printed works (kept in the John Rylands Library in Deansgate). The library subscribes to an extensive range of periodicals and publications of government and international bodies. The unique Manchester collection of books and archives by, and about, Manchester doctors is housed in the main library.

The University Library is usually open Monday to Friday from 8.00 am to 11.30 pm and on Saturdays from 9.00 am to 11.30 pm and Sundays from 12.00 pm to 11.30 pm during term-time. During vacations the Library is usually open Monday to Friday from 8.00 am to 9.30 pm and on Saturdays 9.00 am to 9.30 pm. (Fellows of the Society should check their monthly programme card for the latest information). Fellows may borrow up to twenty volumes at a time. Items not kept in the library may be obtained via the Inter-Library Loans Department for a small charge. Self-service photocopying facilities are available at a reasonable cost.

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5. **CAR PARKING**

Fellows who do not hold a staff permit may use the BOOTH STREET WEST and BOOTH STREET EAST multi-storey car-parks. Both car parks are chargeable.

6. **SUBSCRIPTIONS (from 1.1.2012)**

The annual subscription for Fellowship of the Society is £67.00. A reduced subscription rate of £22.00 applies to Fellows who have retired from practice or reached the age of 65. Applicants should ensure that their date of birth is noted on the application form, as it will be used automatically to reduce subscription rates when retirement age is reached. Retired Fellows who move out of the North West area and who no longer wish to make use of the Library pay a reduced fee of £10.00.

A reduced membership rate for newly qualified doctors exists, ie qualified for 7 years or less. The first year as pre-registration/foundation year doctor/dentist, the annual subscription is FREE, provided a direct debit form is completed for future subscriptions. A reduced subscription of £27.00 applies for years 2-4 inclusive following qualification, and a reduced subscription of £40.00 applies for years 5-7 inclusive following qualification.

“Out-of-Town” and “Overseas” membership exists for those Fellows who move away from the area covered by the Society (North West Region) and no longer wish to make use of the library. The subscriptions are currently £22.00 and £10.00 respectively, payable by direct debit.

Subscriptions, which are payable by a “variable” direct debit, are an allowable expense for income tax purposes and will only be increased after due notification.

Gift Aid

By completing the attached Gift Aid Declaration form, the Society can reclaim the tax that you pay on your subscription. This will effectively increase the value of your subscription by over a quarter. NB: It is our understanding that those Fellows who agree for their subscriptions to be Gift Aided will not also be able to claim back tax paid at the standard rate of income tax, but should be eligible where applicable to claim the difference between the standard and higher rate.

7. **TEMPORARY FELLOWSHIP**

Temporary Fellowship is available to those with medical or dental qualifications holding appointments carrying a normal tenure of two years or less. The subscription is currently £33.50 for six months payable **by cash/cheque only**. Such membership can be renewed for a maximum of three further consecutive six-monthly periods.

8. **PROCEDURE**

The attached proposal form should be signed by one Fellow of the Society who must have been formally elected. Provided that the application form has been completed satisfactorily, and the applicant is a registered medical or dental practitioner, provisional election is immediate. Confirmation of election takes place at the first Council meeting of the Society following provisional election (usually within six months). Applicants who have difficulty in identifying a Fellow to support their application should contact the office of the Society. (See address and telephone numbers overleaf).

The completed form should be returned to the Manchester Medical Society office in the John Rylands University Library (Red 3.2) accompanied by a completed direct debit instruction. A copy of the By-Laws, together with other relevant documents will then be provided by the office. The office is normally open as follows: Monday-Friday 9.00 am to 5.00 pm.

9. **LIBRARY CARDS**

Following approval of your MMS application, a library application form will be sent in your membership pack which you should complete & forward to the John Rylands University Library on Burlington Street. Your library card will be prepared by the library staff and will be available for collection in approximately one week between 10 am and 6.30 pm Monday – Friday. Library cards must be collected in person as your digital image will be processed onto the card.

Although you will not be able to borrow books from the library until your library card has been prepared there is a facility available for obtaining a temporary pass for reading purposes only whilst waiting for your card. Please note there is a charge of £5.00 for lost cards.
