“A multidisciplinary approach to hypodontia”

Patients with hypodontia present us with numerous challenges. Treatment plans are often complex and lengthy, requiring clinical input from several colleagues.

All hypodontia patients at the University Dental Hospital of Manchester are managed by a multi-disciplinary team. Delivering patient-centre, appropriate care within an NHS teaching hospital is often as challenging as the clinical problem itself. Martin Ashley and David Waring are part of the Manchester Hypodontia Team. Their presentation will give guidance for the Restorative Dentistry and Orthodontic management of difficult hypodontia cases and describe the development of this clinical service.

Although, immediate replacement of implants in fresh extraction sockets in the upper anterior region is considered to be somewhat controversial, there is accumulating evidence to show that this could be an optimum solution for patients faced with the loss of their incisors in the so called the aesthetic zone. The advantages include shorter treatment, one less surgical stage, preservation of hard and soft tissue, and optimum aesthetics. This presentation will consider the evidence for and against immediate implant placement and present the results of a 5 year multi-national trial of immediate implant placement of incisor teeth in fresh extraction socket.
